Dear Honolulu Traveler,

The countdown has begun. In just a few short weeks you'll be lying on the beach; snow and cold will be the furthest thing from your mind.

Just a few more details for you

- Care Package:** You will receive your Honolulu "Care Package" including a beach bag upon check-in at the Hilton Hawaiian Village.
- Flight Tickets/Luggage Tags:** If you do not receive your ticket information by 10 days prior to departure, contact Pat Williams at Burkhalter Travel (800) 556-9286 ext.250 or pwilliams@burkhaltertravel.com. If for some reason you will be unable to make your scheduled flight, please contact Pat at Burkhalter to make alternate arrangements.
- Smoking:** Every room at the Hilton Hawaiian Village is smoke-free. There are designated smoking areas at the Resort. You will receive a detailed map illustrating these areas upon arrival at the Resort. Also, smoking is prohibited in any enclosed or partially enclosed facilities open to the public. This includes private businesses, areas of employment and facilities owned by the state or county.
- Transfers:** If you are traveling outside the scheduled program dates; you can either:
 - Meet the group at the airport for the complimentary shuttle to the Hilton Hawaiian Village. If you would like the shuttle schedule, please call Pat at Burkhalter Travel: (800) 556-9286 x250.
 - Arrange transportation (you will be responsible for costs) to the Hilton Hawaiian Village.

USS Missouri Event

Aloha, and welcome to historic Pearl Harbor!

You will gather pier side at the historic Battleship Missouri Memorial (*the "Mighty Mo"*) for a special and memorable journey back in time... a Patriotic Tribute to the Enduring Spirit of two Great Nations, and the peace that bridges two worlds!

You will be able to tour the historic Missouri while knowledgeable docents recreate exciting and grand historical events of the ship's colorful past. The evening will take you back in time as guests recount the "Battle of Pearl Harbor from, a tribute to the Arizona" to the historic signing, paving the way for peace, that took place aboard the Missouri. The refined elegance in cuisine and welcoming Hawaiian style presentation will be complimentary to the elegance and historic grandeur of the "Old Lady", the USS Battleship Missouri. To top the evening off enjoy the rousing entertainment of the Paradise Sisters USO/American Tribute.

Due to strict Navy procedures and protocol several security measures will be in place as you board the ship. Please be aware that the following items are NOT permitted on board: Backpacks, Diaper Bags, Purses, Luggage, Fanny Packs, Shopping Bags or Camera Cases. There are no personal photograph or video restrictions while at the Battleship Missouri Memorial. When preparing for this evening event please plan accordingly based the following restrictions.

- **A photo ID IS required to board the USS Missouri.** (*ID not required for children under age 16*)
- The current baggage control policy is a **"NO BAG POLICY"**
- The "No Bag Policy" states that all bags larger than the size of a hand held radio (*approximately 1½ x 2¼ x 5½ inches*) will be directed to the Bowfin Submarine Park and Museum Baggage Storage Facility. (*Note: There is a nominal per bag fee for the use of the baggage storage facility*).
- Baggage falling under the **"EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES CATEGORY"** may be inspected and allowed or disallowed at the discretion of the Security Officer conducting the inspection.
- "Extenuating Circumstances" exists when a visitor requires assistance such as a wheel chair, walker, and cane; is carrying required medication; feminine products, infant needs; etc. Personal items such as valuables do not fall into this category.
- All other bags, cases, etc., within the baggage size restriction are subject to inspection and may be allowed or disallowed at the discretion of the Security Officer conducting the inspection.

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Hawaiian Words

Aloha (*Traditional*) to share life or breath. (*Alō—to share, ha—breath or life*)

Hawaiian's greeted each other by touching forehead to forehead and nose to nose to allow a commingling of breath. By sharing breath they were also sharing a part of what gives us life. They used this gesture or custom to say hello and goodbye, in ceremonial rituals and to show affection towards one another therefore we have the modern meaning of aloha. (*Modern*) Hello, goodbye, or an expression of affection.

ʻAina	Land, earth
Aliʻi	Chief, chiefess, or royalty
Hana	work
Heiau	Pre-Christian shrine or place of worship
Hoa	Friend
Hula	The dance of Ha
Ipo	Sweetheart
Imu	An underground oven you see at a luau
Kahuna	A priest, minister, or an expert at any profession
Kai	The ocean
Kamaʻaina	Native born
Kane	A man or boy
Kapu	Sacred, taboo, forbidden, no trespassing
Keiki	Child, offspring, or children
Kokua	Help or give assistance
Lei	A necklace of flowers, leaves, shells, etc.
Lua	restroom
Luʻau	Literally means young taro tops, but used for a Hawaiian feast
Mahalo	Thanks, gratitude
Makai	Ocean, used to mean "toward the ocean"
Malihini	A stranger, foreigner, tourist, etc.
Mauka	Toward the mountains
Manaʻo	thought, idea or opinion
Ohana	Family
Nui	Big, large, great, or important
Ono	Delicious or tasty, and also a wahoo, a type of fish
Pali	Cliff, a steep hill or slope
Paniolo	Hawaiian cowboy
Pau	Finished, ended, all done
Pau Hana	Finished work
Poi	A paste made from pounded taro root
Puka	hole

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
